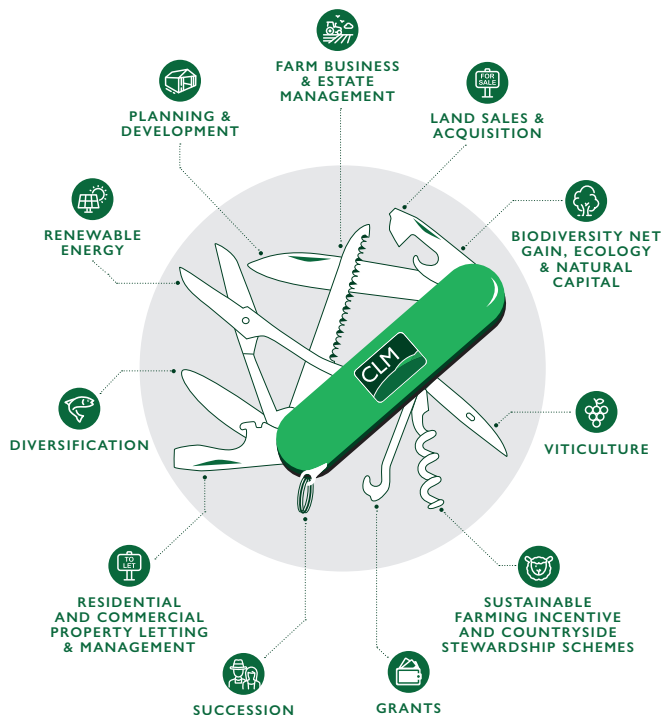

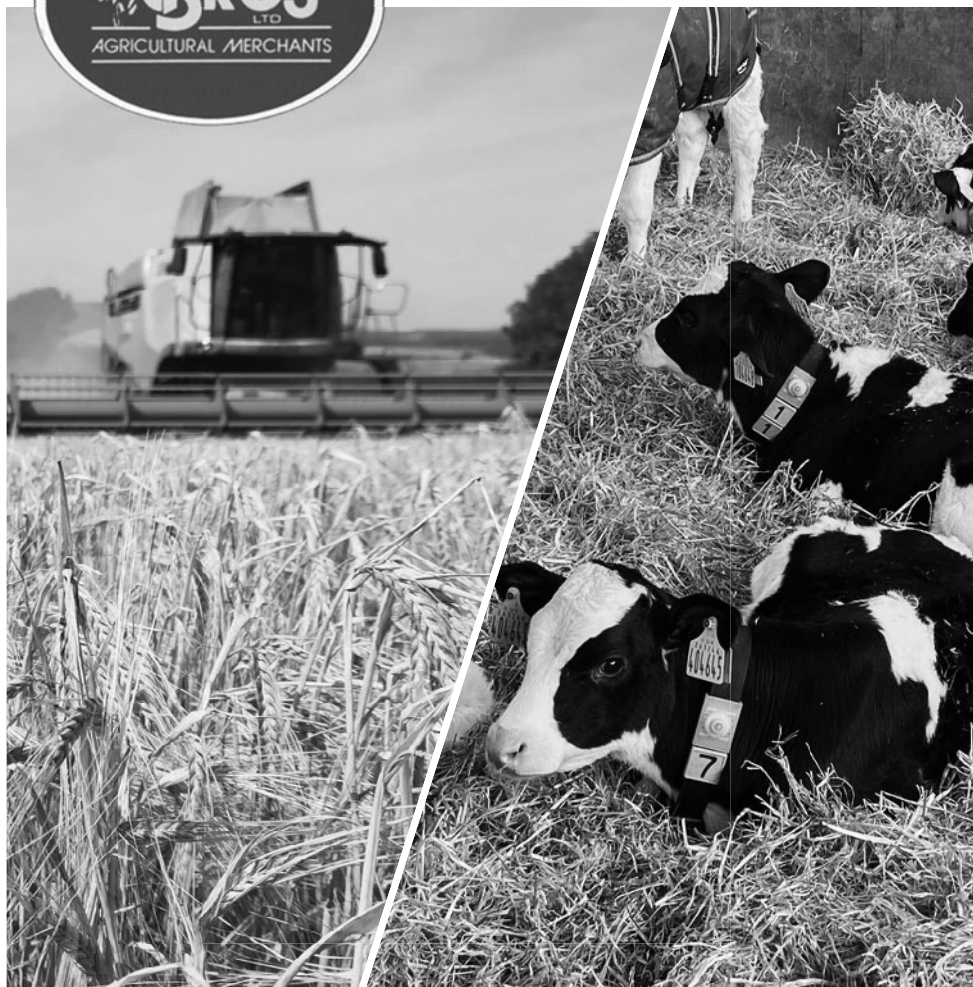

Rules and Regulations

- 1 That the Society, established in the interests of Agriculture and for the encouragement of skilled labour, be called the "Crowborough and District Ploughing Match Society."
- 2 The District over which the operations of the Society shall extend comprises of the whole of that area lying within a 15 mile radius of Crowborough Cross.
- 3 The Society shall include Patrons, President, Vice-Presidents and Members from whom the Committee of Management shall be elected annually.
- 4 The Committee of Management shall consist of not less than 12 Members with power to add to their number. If a Committee Member does not attend at least 1 Committee Meeting in any year or send his apologies for absence it will be assumed the following year that he does not wish to remain on the Committee.
- 5 A Member shall be defined as a person paying to the Society an Annual Subscription of a minimum of £6.00, or a couple paying £10.00, and shall be entitled to free car park and entry to the Ploughing Match Showground for the Member only.
- 6 Entries to the Competitions may be accepted from non-members.
- 7 Entrants for the Society's Competitions shall be restricted to an area referred to in Rule 2 with the exception of the open classes.
- 8 The Rules and Conditions of Entry for the Society's Competitions are to be determined by the Committee for the year.
- 9 There shall be a General Meeting of the Society held annually in December, when the Audited Accounts shall be presented and Officers elected.
- 10 Fourteen Days prior Notice shall be given of the Annual General Meeting together with any proposals for alterations to the rules.
- 11 A Quorum of the Committee of Management shall constitute a minimum of 6 Members
- 12 Subscriptions and Donations shall become due and payable on the 1st day of October in each year and should be paid to the Treasurer.
- 13 The committee reserves the right to refuse any entry, without stating their reason.
- 14 The Society, its officers or servants shall not be responsible to any person whatsoever while upon the premises being used by the Society, or while entering or leaving the same for any damage or loss however caused to the property or any such person or for any injury, fatal or otherwise, to any such person.

Rules and Regulations Continued

- 15 The Committee reserve the right to reduce the number of prizes, or amalgamate or cancel Classes, in the event of insufficient entries being received. The following number of entries must be forthcoming to permit the prizes mentioned.
- 1 A minimum of 2 entries or the class is to be cancelled
- An entrant shall not be awarded more than one prize, for the same variety, in any one class.
- 16 **Roots, Corn, Hay and Hop Classes**
Limited to a radius of 15 miles of Crowborough Cross. All specimens from not less than two acres.
- No specimens allowed from a mixed crop. All roots untrimmed, tops left on and show a minimum of six on day of show.
- The Committee reserve the right to disqualify any entry not staged by 10.15 a.m. All entries in Classes 4-15 to be current year crops
- Trusses or Bales to weigh not less than 20lbs
- The growing cereals cup - the points will only be allocated to the challenge cup if there are more than 3 entries
- 17 **Dairy, Beef and Sheep Classes**
All animals exhibited must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor on the dates of entry and judging.
- 18 **Rules for 'Points Challenge Cup'**
The Points Silver Challenge Cup will be presented for the competitor with the maximum number of points in Classes 4-41.
- Points will be allocated as follows:- Classes 4-15:
- 1st 3 points, 2nd 2 points, 3rd 1 point.
- Classes 16-41:
- 1st 6 points, 2nd 4 points, 3rd 2 points.
- Only the best winning entry for each competition in any one class may qualify for points.

Rules for the Tractor Ploughing

- 1 Competitors shall commence at **9.00am** and ploughs must be out on the ground by **8.30am**.
- 2 Each competitor having completed his opening split will not continue until told by the Steward.
- 3 Drawing on headlands forbidden. It is forbidden to draw any scratch or other mark on the headland with the plough and on NO account must any plough be put into the ground on the site, either before the starting signal or at any time during the course of the competition.
- 4 Any ploughman not having ploughed his ground within **four hours** from the time of starting will be excluded from receiving a prize.
- 5 No assistance allowed except setting and removing the sighting posts.
- 6 Important Notice. After completion of setting out no person other than the competitor, authorised officials and judges will be allowed on any plot.
- 7 Time Limit. The ploughing of the Crown and gathered work shall be completed not later than **10.30am**, any competitor not having completed his Crown and gathered work by **10.30am** will not be awarded any points for same.
- 8 No shaping of furrows or scratching by hand held instruments, by treading or other manipulation will be allowed.
- 9 Rolling and the use of boats, floats or presses not to be allowed.
- 10 Competitors must make a double opening split at the setting out. The strip must be well cut through and deep enough so that no land is left unturned in the middle of the ridge. The start must consist of a minimum of 8 furrows.
- 11 Competitors must cast towards the neighbouring plot with the next consecutive letter.
- 12 Vacant neighbouring plot. When a competitor has a vacant plot he shall be allowed 15 minutes extra time for setting out sighting poles in order to plough up to the place where otherwise he would be backing his neighbours work.
- 13 When a competitor is obliged to wait on his neighbour he may with the permission of the Steward proceed to draw a scratch cast-off.
- 14 The last furrow must be thrown towards own crown. Only one tractor wheelmark allowed for on the finish which shall be made on the normal course of ploughing.
- 15 Tractor ploughing depth not less than 6 inches.
- 16 Skims will be used by all competitors.
- 17 Breach of the Ploughing Rules. It must be clearly understood that if the minimum requirements for the Ploughing as stated in the rules is not complied with, then the offending competitor's work will be penalised.
- 18 Any question arising and not provided for in these Rules will be decided by the Committee, whose decision shall be final and binding.

Rules for Horse Ploughing

1. Competitors shall commence at 11.00am.
2. Openings will be inspected by judges.
3. Each competitor to show 10 furrows before starting to split out to neighbouring plot.
4. All ploughing except first and last furrows to be a minimum of 5 inches deep and 9 inches wide.
5. Competitors shall be allowed one assistant to lead horses for the first and last five turns.
6. No boats or presses to be used, and competitors not finishing on time will lose points.
7. Any question arising and not provided for in these rules will be decided by the Committee whose decision will be final and binding.
